

Information on Processing Your Personal Data Within the Scope of the Fuzzing Internals study (PhD Project of Sriteja Kummita), Pursuant to Art. 13 of General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

This data privacy policy describes how your personal data is processed within the scope of the Fuzzing Internals study. By issuing this policy, Sriteja Kummita (the controller) is complying with its duty to provide information pursuant to Art. 13 of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (hereinafter referred to as GDPR). With regard to the terms used in the following, e.g. "personal data", "processing", "controller", etc., please refer to the definitions in Art. 4 of the GDPR.

Categories, Purposes and Legal Bases of the Processing of Your Personal Data

Within the scope of Fuzzing Internals study, the controller will process your personal data as follows for the following purposes and in line with the legal bases listed below:

Purpose 1: communication regarding the study

The following personal data is processed for this purpose: First name, Last name, Email address

Purpose 2: Interview with video-recording (Zoom) including introduction, online questionnaires, fulfilling the tasks in a web application, follow-up questions, transcription, analysis, anonymization in order to conduct the Fuzzing Internals study

The following personal data is processed for this purpose: Videoconferencing (where possible video recordings and/or audio recordings) and online-questionnaires concerning the Fuzzing Internals study

Information on the study procedure:

The study will only be conducted online where the participants a) completes the demographic and study related questionnaires in LimeSurvey b) fulfils the task in the Fuzzing Internals web application and c) discusses follow-up questions in Zoom (Paderborn University license, with a video- or audio-recording).

Further data processing steps are: creation of transcripts, anonymisation, presentation and publication of the results with anonymised data only.

Note:

LimeSurvey is hosted by Paderborn University. The videoconferencing system Zoom is used with the license of Paderborn University. Email address will be only used to communicate with study participants. It will be deleted once the user study has been concluded.

Audio and video recordings will only be used for the creation of transcripts for data analysis. They will be deleted once the study results have been concluded.

Subsequent presentations and publications will only be made with anonymised data.

The legal bases for processing your personal data is your consent according to Art. 6 para 1 subpara 1(a) GDPR,

In the case of sensitive data, Art. 9 of the GDPR applies, if necessary with further specifications.

2. Recipients of Your Personal Data

In principle, the controller does not transfer your personal data that is processed by him within the scope of the Fuzzing Internals study to third parties. In individual cases, data may be transferred to third parties in compliance with a legal authorization.. If (technical) service providers have access to personal data, in case of need the data is processed on the basis of an arrangement in accordance with Art. 28 GDPR. In the event data is processed with other controllers, in case of need the data is processed on the basis of an arrangement in accordance with Art. 26 GDPR

- Paderborn University has signed a data processing agreement pursuant to Art. 28 GDPR for the use of Zoom.

3. Transferring Your Personal Data Outside of the EU

In principle, no personal data is transferred to countries outside the European Economic Area and associated countries (no “third country transfer”). If such a transfer becomes necessary, the controller will inform you of this separately.

The participants will be reminded not to enter personal data while working on the task with internet access.

4. Duration of Storage of Your Personal Data

Your personal data that will be processed within the scope of the Fuzzing Internals study by the controller as described above will generally be deleted as soon as it is no longer required for the purposes for which it was collected, i.e. we will delete it immediately after the study evaluation has concluded, latest by the end of 2027.

5. Your Rights as a Data Subject

As a data subject, you may assert the rights granted to you by the GDPR at any time; these are:

- the right to know if and which of your personal data is being processed in accordance with Art. 15 GDPR, Section 12 DSG NRW;
- the right to have any inaccurate personal data about you rectified or incomplete data completed in accordance with Art. 16 GDPR;
- the right to have your personal data deleted (erased) in accordance with Art.17 GDPR, Section 10 DSG NRW;
- the right to have the data processing restricted in accordance with Art. 18 GDPR;
- the right to transmit any data about you in accordance with Art. 20 GDPR.

6. Withdrawal of Consent

Any consent that may have been granted can be revoked (withdrawn) in whole or in part at any time without providing a reason. The withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent before its withdrawal (Art. 7 (3) GDPR). If you revoke your consent, the controller will not be allowed to continue the data processing based on this consent in the future. If you want to revoke your consent in whole or in part, all you need to do is send an e-mail to the controller.

7. Right to Lodge a Complaint

In addition to the aforementioned rights, you also have the right to lodge a complaint with a data protection supervisory authority (Art. 77 GDPR) if you believe that the processing of personal data relating to you infringes the requirements of data protection law for example, the complaint can be submitted to the state commissioner responsible for overseeing the controller: Landesbeauftragte für Datenschutz und Informationsfreiheit Nordrhein-Westfalen (State Commissioner for Data Protection and Freedom of Information in North Rhine-Westphalia), Kavalleriestr. 2-4, 40213 Düsseldorf, Germany; phone: +49 (0)211 38424-0, e-mail: poststelle@ldi.nrw.de

8. Automated Decision-making / Profiling

The controller does not use automated decision making or profiling according to Art. 22 GDPR.
